FIRE PLUGS

One project that the ASG may be able to undertake is replacing the box for retiring damaged flags at the North End Fire Station. After the winter we have many flags that are in poor condition. Flags that are put into the box are taken to the American Legion in the Sault for proper disposal.

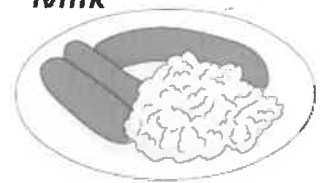

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Sugar Island Volunteer Fire Department **"Auxiliary Support Group"** is to provide non-emergency, low hazard volunteer support to the Sugar Island Fire Department and its members.



ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES

AUXILIARY SUPPORT GROUP TEAM MEMBERS

- ASG team members operate under the express direction of the Chief of Sugar Island's Fire Department, or his/her appointed deputy.
- ASG team members shall only provide non-emergency, low hazard support to the Sugar Island Fire Department and its members.

Assignments may include, but are not limited to:



Equipment, tooling & facility preventative maintenance



Firefighter rehab support



Fundraising



Other non-emergency tasks as assigned by the FD Chief

Public relations



Training support

- Team members shall be appointed to the "Auxiliary Support Group" via a majority vote of the officers of the Sugar Island Fire Department, and approval by the FD Chief.
- **AUXILIARY SUPPORT GROUP LIAISON OFFICER**
 - To help disseminate orders from the FD Chief to ASG team members, oversee the completion of assignments, and to facilitate communication between ASG and FD personnel, the FD Chief may appoint an ASG Liaison Officer.
 - Preferably, the appointed liaison officer should be a current officer or firefighter of the Sugar Island Fire Department.

Sugar Island Township News

The snow is almost gone and sogginess is everywhere. In many places around the Island, the ditches are not yet overgrown with vegetation and the accumulated remnants of debris from the winter. If a resident has ditches on their property, now is the time to remove branches, limbs, garbage and other items that might clog them and ultimately harbor mosquitoes. Removing this debris will help the sogginess drain and the likelihood that the property won't be continuously inundated by those nasty winged creatures. Regardless of what we do, mosquitoes will exist, but we can take proactive steps to reduce their influence on the quality of our lives.

The Township Board voted at the April 14th meeting to approve a new voluntary Auxiliary Support Group (ASG) Team Charter to support our Fire Department. The stated purpose of the ASG *"is to provide non-emergency, low hazard volunteer support to the Sugar Island Fire Department, and its members."* More information will be available through a variety of other sources so if one wishes to participate they can contact a local Sugar Island Township Firefighter.

As you may be aware, Chippewa County has instituted a load limit restriction that limits construction and the movement of trucks with heavier loads across county roads. This limitation restricts the ability of contractors to haul sand/gravel and concrete providers to deliver their materials. This delay is a normal reality and unfortunately, may be longer this year so people planning to build larger structures should plan accordingly.

Our seasonal residents will be returning this spring to find missing, damaged, or deteriorating mailboxes. The United States Post Office has very defined expectations for proper box markings and everybody should take the time and effort to ensure their boxes are marked properly. Additionally, even if property owners don't use the mailbox, placing proper markings on mailboxes serves as an effective way for emergency service providers (i.e., Sheriff, Ambulance and Fire Department) to expeditiously locate the property, and to respond to the correct address in a timely manner. The Township Board has agreed to meet on Tuesday, May 26th at 6:00pm at the Community Center for a Special Meeting for the purposes of redistributing Township Board member duties and responsibilities. Many of the duties and responsibilities of the elected Township Board are clearly defined within various statutes but most are not. We will go through the ever-growing list and try to ensure that we don't leave required tasks unassigned. This process allows us to build competence and to reduce redundances and confusion. Once the assignments are published, staff and board members will know who has the designated responsibility to deal with specific issues when residents have questions or concerns. It also helps to reduce the burden on any one or two Board members.

TO BE HELD TUESDAY, MAY 5, 2026**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a Special Election will be held in the regular voting place in each precinct in each City and Township in the County of Chippewa, State of Michigan, on Tuesday, May 5, 2026, between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 8:00 P.M.

Said purpose of the May 5, 2026, Special Election will to be to vote on the following proposals:

**EASTERN UPPER PENINSULA INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL DISTRICT
AREA CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION
MILLAGE RENEWAL AND RESTORATION PROPOSAL**

This proposal will allow the intermediate school district to continue to levy millage previously approved by the electors for area career and technical education programs and restores millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963.

Shall the currently authorized millage rate limitation of .9892 mill (\$0.9892 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in Eastern Upper Peninsula Intermediate School District, Michigan, to provide funds for area career and technical education programs, be renewed for a period of 10 years, 2027 to 2036, inclusive; and also be increased by .0108 mill (\$0.0108 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 10 years, 2027 to 2036, inclusive; if the millage is approved, the intermediate school district will be authorized to levy area career and technical education millage at the rate of 1.00 mill (\$1.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) as previously approved by the electors on May 2, 2017, and, if levied in 2027, will collect approximately \$3,280,256 from local property taxes authorized herein (this is a renewal of millage that will expire with the 2026 tax levy and a restoration of millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963)?

All polling places are handicap accessible. Voting instructions in alternate formats (audio and Braille) are available upon request. Voter Assist machines are available in each precinct. Voter Assist machines are designed to allow voters who are disabled to vote "in a manner that provides the same opportunity for access and participation (including privacy and independence) as for other voters."

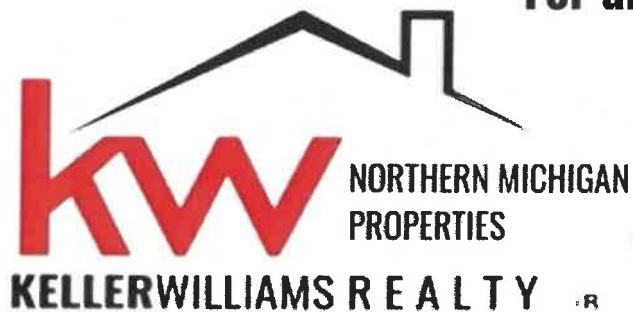
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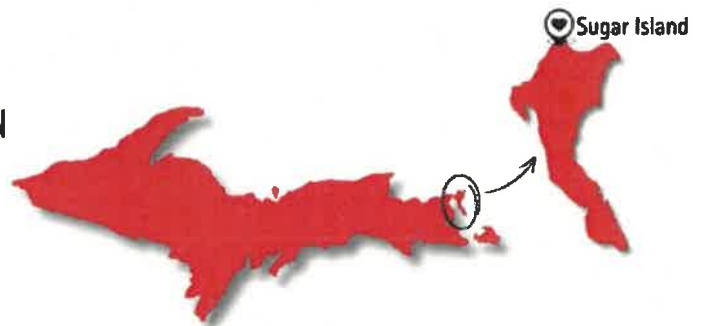
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
